Dear Ms. Burley:

On May 12, 2021, Citgo Petroleum Corporation ("CITGO") requested a waiver of the coastwise merchandise transportation statute (46 U.S.C. § 55102 or the "Jones Act") to utilize a foreign-flag vessel to load up to 160,000 barrels of jet fuel, 125,000 barrels of gasoline, and 15,000 barrels of ultra-low sulfur diesel ("the Cargo") for a combined 300,000 barrels to be loaded at CITGO Terminal Lake Charles, Louisiana, and discharged at CITGO Terminal Linden, New Jersey. CITGO requested a loading date (ready for pick-up) on May 13 and indicated the cargo must be shipped by May 14 with an ultimate delivery date of 20/21 May.

Pursuant to 46 U.S.C. § 501(b), the Maritime Administration canvassed the U.S. maritime industry to assess the availability of coastwise-qualified vessels for the movement of the subject petroleum products. This survey did not identify any coastwise-qualified U.S.-flag vessels that are available for the required load date of tomorrow, May 14. Therefore, MARAD's assessment is that coastwise-qualified vessels are not available to move this cargo at the stated time. This determination is subject to reassessment under changed circumstances, such as modifications to the cargo load dates.
